OYYAS Mission:

To promote personal and family growth by ensuring youth and young adults experiencing substance use and co-occurring disorders have access to developmentally appropriate, culturally responsive, traumainformed services and supports.

OYYAS Goals:

01

Build and support the Office of Youth and Young Adult Services and its providers to maintain a continuum of integrated and comprehensive services.

02

Facilitate efforts to <u>improve</u> external workforce capacity to effectively engage with youth and young adults with substance use and other cooccurring disorders and their families.

03

Promote and support developmentally tailored youth and young adult recovery communities and peer support networks.

04

Utilize <u>research and data to</u> <u>drive system change</u> by identifying gaps to influence continuous quality improvement.



Explicitly address structural inequities by applying a social justice lens to amplify the voice of historically marginalized and oppressed populations and increase community engagement.















School Based Intensive Intervention:

- ✓ Intensive Case Management
- ✓ School-based long-term (6-24 months) intervention
- ✓ Serves youth ages 8-17 at risk for developing substance use disorder
- ✓ Goal to reduce risk factors & increase protective factors to prevent future substance use
- ✓ Students are identified and referred by school staff or parents can refer based on: CRAFFT scores, emotional dysregulation, school attachment, academic performance, conduct problems, and family history of substance use
- ✓ Continued expansion of program model




High School Co-occurring Response Teams

- ✓ Partnership between communitybased behavioral health providers and their local high schools.
- ✓ Three levels of care:
 - Intervention (Project Amp)
 - Diversion (iDECIDE)
 - Treatment (A-CRA)
- ✓ Students referred by school staff, outside collaborative agencies, parent(s), or self-referred.
- ✓ Targets "at-risk" students.
- ✓ Team: A-CRA Supervisor; A-CRA Clinician; & Project Amp Mentor.
- ✓ Multiple service components including individual, group, and family supports.



IDECIDE

- Education-based intervention for students caught violating school substance use policy.
- Science-based alternative to suspension, expulsion, and other exclusionary practices.
- Students participating in iDECIDE will gain:
- ✓ A scientific understanding of the impact of substances on the adolescent brain and body,
- ✓ An understanding of the common tactics used by companies to target youth,
- An ability to identify and respond to personal impulses and,
- ✓ A sense of empowerment to make healthier, positive choices.
- iDECIDE is a collaboration between OYYAS,
 Massachusetts General Hospital, the
 Institute for Health and Recovery.



Outpatient Treatment

Adolescent Community Reinforcement Approach (A-CRA)

- A-CRA is a behavioral intervention for youth and young adults ages 12-24 that seeks to increase the family, social, and educational/vocational reinforcers of an adolescent/young adult to support recovery from substance abuse and dependence.
- OYYAS currently has 34 A-CRA locations representing 17 agencies across the Commonwealth.

In FY22 – OYYAS hosted 75 separate workshops open to youth serving professionals across state agencies





In June 2019, OYYAS released *Opioid Use Among Adolescents & Young Adults: Toolkit for Pediatric & Primary Care Providers.*

- This toolkit was developed specifically for pediatric, primary care, and other health professionals treating adolescents and young adults within their medical practice. This document is currently being updated to include new regulations and protocols.
